This letter suggests curious multitude of theories, but the most likely, is referred to the fish as the "Fishermen", in the followers of God. In the song, the fish (believers) "drink and drink," that is, "celebrate", the birth of Jesus.

Its so original letter, that it has become one of the most authentic carols sang year after year. It is one of the most universally loved by children. Many singers have covered it, including, for example, the Gipsy Kings made their own version of rumba.

Unlike other carols in this letter focuses on the Virgin Mary, is reflected in the river and the purity of her body, her hair ... The verse that follows speaks of the birth of Jesus, the virgin then washing diapers newborn ...

The story of Jesus told in another tone, not sounding bells here, or bagpipes, nor are the kings ... in this carol and with his metric transmits tranquility and harmony.
