In the Orthodox Church, this rite is usually called the Divine Liturgy, rather than the Mass. So on each saint's day the communities celebratethis special days with festivals that take place outside the local church. Young men and women used to go to these festivals always accompanied by their parentsto meet other people, to dance and sing.

Women used to go to the village's fountain to wash their clothes and to get some water. There, they used to meet with other young women who went there for the same purpose. Sometimes the village's fountains where places where men and women had the opportunity to meet, talk

and flirt.
